DAI BACCARAT

HOW TO PLAY

Dai Baccarat is an elegant, simple game to play. There are only two decisions to make: how much to bet, and whether to bet on the Bank or the Player. To bet on the Bank, a Player simply places his/her bet in the area closest to his/her marker "Banker." Likewise, to bet on the Player, a Player simply places his/her bet on the area marked "Player." An additional bet a Player may make is a Tie Bet (that the two hands will end in equal totals). A winning Tie Bet pays 8 to 1. As for the game itself, Dai Baccarat is played with eight decks of cards. Any card from 2 to 9 has its face value. Ace equals one. All 10's and face cards, or any combination of them, have no value. When the total of the cards exceeds 9, the first digit of the total is dropped, because in the game of Dai Baccarat, all hands must be a single-digit number from 0 to 9. So, 7 + 4 = 1, Queen + Ace = 1.

The game begins when four cards are dealt alternately from the shoe: the first card to the Player, the second card to the Bank, the third card to the Player and the fourth card to the Bank. If the point count of either hand is 8 or 9, it is called a Natural and no additional cards are drawn. The cards are dealt according to set rules. There are no options regarding drawing the third card for either the Player's or Banker's hand. The dealer announces the point count of the Plaver's hand and the Banker's hand and the dealer will draw additional cards when appropriate. All bets must be placed before the dealer calls "No more bets" and the cards are dealt. No more than one additional card will be drawn to each hand. The hand closest to 9 wins and is paid at odds of 1 to 1. When the Banker wins with a 3-Card 7, the Banker pushes. If both the Player's and a Banker's hand result in identical totals, it is a Tie Hand and the Tie Bet wins; neither hand wins nor loses. These charts describe the fixed rules governing the drawing of additional cards.

BANKER'S RULES

When Players stand on 6 or 7, the Banker will always draw on totals of 0, 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and stand on 6, 7, 8 and 9. When the Player does not have a "Natural" (8-9) the banker shall always draw on the totals of 0, 1 or 2, and then observe the following rules:

Tiger 7: Wins 40-1 when the Banker hand has a 3-card total of 7 and wins.

Ox 6: Wins 40-1 when the Player has a 3-card 6 total and wins

Kill Bonus: Two ways to win 30-1!

When the Tiger Bonus bet loses with a 3-card Banker 7

When the Ox Bonus bet loses with a 3-card Player 6

All side bets lose in a tie except the Kill bet which wins in these scenarios: Both Player and Banker hands ties with 3-card totals of 6-or-7 The Player's 3-card 6 ties the Banker's 2-card 6 The Player's 2-card 7 ties the Banker's 3-card 7
